As PFMD enters its second decade, we stand on foundations built together, by a community that turned Patient Engagement (PE) from an idea into infrastructure.

The change has always been about the shared conviction that healthcare works best when it is built with patients, not for them.

For those of us who have been with PFMD from the beginning, this next chapter is about protecting the impact you've already built — preserving good practices, ensuring PE remains meaningful and impactful, and continuing to serve as a guiding light for the wider community.

And it's also about going further, faster. The frameworks, trust, and shared standards created over the past decade are now shaping how regulators, funders, and innovators work worldwide. Staying at the table ensures your leadership continues to guide the standards and policies that will define the next generation of healthcare.

For those not yet part of PFMD, this is your moment to step in.

The world is no longer debating whether patient engagement matters — that question is settled.

What matters now is how it is implemented, and who will lead in shaping its future.

By joining this community, you don't just follow the shift, you influence it. You bring your voice and perspective into the global framework being built.

Based on our collective experience reimagining PE, Patient Experience Data (PED), clinical trials, ESG and more, our community is ideally placed to shape the future. It is not too late to get on board, and in fact, now is the ideal time to do so.

The next decade of patient engagement will echo the defining moments of past generations. Just as the HIV/AIDS movement reshaped public health in the 1980s, online communities transformed access in the 1990s, and privacy debates defined the 2010s, the 2020s and 2030s will be remembered as the era when patient voices became fundamental to how we design, deliver, and sustain healthcare.

In an age shaped by Artificial Intelligence — and at a time when civil society itself is under pressure — nothing is more vital than embedding patient and public engagement into the core of our systems.



Foreword

Ten years ago, a group of people with a common goal sat down together to address a deep-rooted challenge in healthcare: the absence of patients in the decisions that shaped their care.

We believed then — as we do now — that healthcare must be built with patients, not for them. That conviction sparked a movement that has grown into a global community, powered by practical tools, shared standards and publications, and deep trust.

Back then, patient engagement (PE) was fragmented and inconsistent. There was no shared language, no agreed definition of what "good" looked like, and few ways to measure or replicate success. The barriers weren't only technical — they were cultural, institutional, and systemic.

Through collective action, the PE community began to shape and gradually change that. Together, we co-created the tools and guidance needed to do patient engagement well.

Together, we built a virtual and real-world network to map, connect, and support practitioners around the globe.

Together, we grew from 10 founding members to 62, with thousands more contributing through working groups, public consultations, and real-world implementation.

This report is not just a record of PFMD's progress — it is a story of shared achievement. It captures what the community has made possible: the shift from awareness to application, from siloed projects to embedded infrastructure, from passive consultation to active co-creation.

None of this would have been possible without you — the patient advocates (including people with lived experience, their loved ones and caregivers, and representatives of patient and advocacy organizations), researchers, regulators, investors, clinicians, and companies who have helped shape this ecosystem. PFMD's role has been to convene, support, and accelerate your work; to set standards, build capacity, lay the foundations for a community, and help navigate the path ahead.

As we reflect on this decade of progress, we also recognize how much more there is to do. Patient engagement is now expected in many settings — but not yet embedded everywhere. The groundwork has been laid. What comes next depends on us and on how we continue to build it — together.








After ten years, the PFMD tree – rooted in collaboration –continues to branch out and blossom.

How We Got Here


How We Got Here From pilots to policies: how shared tools, open access, and collaboration changed the system.

Systems are shifting:

- Regulators using co-created guidance to shape new standards.
- Companies adopting frameworks that change how engagement is structured.
- Investors embedding patient perspectives into ESG and risk decisions.
- Patient advocates leveraging shared tools to push for meaningful change.
- Health systems are adapting PE resources locally, proving they work anywhere.

PFMD continues to serve four key roles: standard setting, capability building, community building, and thought leadership. The collective impact is our shared achievement. It is proof that patient engagement, once optional, is now becoming standard practice across the ecosystem.

Ten years of work made these shifts possible. Each framework, training, and platform built under PFMD's umbrella was created with the community — open access, co-created, and scalable. The result: what began as scattered projects is now measurable infrastructure shaping decisions across regulation, policy, investment, and care.




2015–2019 Building Foundations

What happened

Patient engagement was still fragmented. Together, early adopters built the shared language, trust, and first practical tools to make engagement real.

Key moments

- Co-created the **PE Quality Guidance** (7 criteria that define what "good" looks like).
- Published the first **Book of Good Practices** to capture real-world examples.
- Launched **Synapse**, the first global mapping of PE people, organisations, and resources.
- Founded the Patient Engagement Open Forum (PEOF) —
 a safe and brave space for collaboration.
- Adapted core resources for MedTech companies and delivered the first conference session linking PE to ESG priorities


What happened

Once the language was built, the community scaled it.

Companies, regulators, and advocates began embedding structured engagement into their systems and training their people.

Key moments

- Expanded to 63 member organisations; co-created the Patient Engagement Management Suite (How-to Guides, Metric Selector, Global Patient Experience Data Navigator).
- Rolled out the PE Training Program, reaching 38 000 learners and giving 500 000 employees access across 11 pharma companies, and co-created a dedicated MedTech adaptation in partnership with MedTech companies and patient organisations.
- Launched the Made with Patients Awards to celebrate and benchmark excellence.
- Adapted resources for MedTech and began linking PE to ESG and sustainability priorities.

What happened


Key moments

- Regulators and payers citing PE Guidance and PED Navigator in reflection papers and guidelines.
- Investors incorporating patient perspectives into ESG criteria.
- Health systems across Asia and Europe adapting PE tools locally.
- Incubated the "initiation of new engines of change" including Clinical Trials Data Network (CTDN) and its contributions to IHI-READI, Patient Engagement Professionals Society (PEPS), Patient Movement Catalyst (PMC).






